# 4. Outstanding and New Actions

## 4.1 Beach and Mitchell Street Works

- Project has been delayed and now linked to CN Plan for Dalby Oval and the Soldiers memorial
- Work will take approx. 6 months once commenced
- 5.3 **Shopping Centre Update:** No progress on issues of concern to local community. SCG Inc continues to liaise with CN and Councillors to highlight ongoing concerns.

- 6.3 Air Quality & Environment: (Keith Craig)
- Work has commenced on installation of the \$36m scrubber at Orica, due to be completed mid-2024.
- Installation of reactors to reduce nitric acid-nitric oxide greenhouse acids has commenced.
- The future of the NCCCE forum is yet to be confirmed. There have been no air quality reports issued this year. Letter to be sent to Newcastle MP requesting committee be reconvened. Action: AR/MT
- An information session on the Hydrogen Plant on Kooragang was held by Origin Energy during June, approx. 40 people attended. SCG Inc asked questions on:
  - traffic impact on Kooragang
  - noise during construction
  - noise during operation of plant
  - relationship with Clean Energy Hub (PON)
  - Plant safety mechanisms
- 6.4 Community/Crown Land (Carolyn Bailey)
- No further response to SCG Inc comments on CN Draft Crown Land Management Plan
- The 16 cabins relocated to Crown Land are currently being sold via online auction, closing date

- today. The successful bidder is required to remove the cabins within 3 months of settlement.
- Funding from the sale is to go the Rawson Reserve Trust. SCG Inc will continue to follow up on how these funds are utilised
- Ongoing issues being followed up with CN and Councillors include shopping centre issues, Lion's
   Park car park repair, upgrade of public toilets and access to water and toilets at the Breakwater.
- 6.5 Stockton Community Liaison Group (SCLG) (Barbara Whitcher)
- Draft Coastal Management Plan pending
- Maintenance using sand scrapping continues with good effect.
- Mitchell St works see Agenda item 4.1.
- King St breakwater access has reopened.
- SCG Inc members (6) are now representatives on the SCLG.
- Ongoing correspondence with Minister Tanya Moriarty to clarify reporting and decision-making responsibilities.
- Concerns raised about the multiple agencies now involved in the beach restoration and related risks.
- There is a letter on SCG Inc website which has been sent to MP's requesting clarification of accountabilities.

  - The new Marine Rescue base is now operational, located at 67 King St Stockton
  - Marine Rescue is a volunteer organisation, not for profit charity, partly funded by NSW government
  - Key functions are search and rescue, radio monitoring and on water assistance to the boating community
  - There are a range of roles within the unit including radio operators and boat crew. Roles involve intensive training. There are also roles for community members who wish to support the unit but prefer non-operational volunteer work.
